AARON AND NORBERT'S STORIES



Aaron (top and left) is 8, despite his tiny frame. He has hydrocephalus and almost died due to malnutrition. We provided a life-saving food package as well as a mattress and radio (which he loves).



Recently orphaned Norbert (left), has learning difficulties. He lives alone, and our food package saved his life.

EVANS' STORY OF HOPE



When we first met Evans he was continually crying in pain. Born without arms and a single finger on his left shoulder, he was so severely malnourished and distressed, we thought he might die.

That was two years ago. Now 4, he's thriving thanks to the high nutrition, high calorie food, vitamins and pain killers we provided. He's gained weight, can sit up, walk with a little help - and even kick a ball!

Mum Hannah said: **"Life was hard to me and my child. There were a time I thought he might die - but now we are fine, we have hope."**
