Help children learn well

It all begins with a bowl of food.

A daily meal brings more than sustenance – it brings hope, opportunity and a remarkable ripple effect, making it incredible value for money.

In Upper West Ghana, where children often eat just four times a week in lean season, school attendance averages 33%. Less than half of children finish school.

We are changing that. A nutritious school lunch, along with educational materials and period products for girls, is transforming access to education. Attendance at our partner schools averages 88% - and pupils are learning on full stomachs and with dignity.

This project is at the heart of our work - yet we have five rural junior high schools (JHS) where we currently have no funding for this vital work. Could you support some of the 488 pupils at Dowine, Biro, Gombile, Kalsagri or Girls Model and give them the chance to change their lives?
