Help more girls like Lucy change the world

Girls growing up in ultra rural Ghana face a future of teen pregnancy and marriage, subsistence farming or the dangerous option of travelling south for work. They face a life of not meeting their potential.

THE LUCY PROJECT changes that. They can thrive in school, become economically independent and be valued members of the community. Like Lucy, they could even go to university - and become role models for future generations. We can make this happen by providing:

- a life-changing daily meal for the girls at Lucy's old school in Biro, so they can study on full stomachs;
- education materials that will enable them to thrive;
- monthly period products, giving them dignity and respect;
- all the provisions needed for girls to continue their education at senior high school;
- advocacy and support to keep girls in education, creating role models for the future.

£2,500 buys lunch for all the girls at Lucy's school for a whole year

£500 buys them educational materials like stationery and maths sets

£250 provides period products every month
£500 sends a girl to senior high school for three years

£2000 contributes to Olivia's salary supporting girls through SHS



LUCY'S STORY



When we met Lucy in 2017 she was one of only twelve children at her rural village school in Biro, Upper West Ghana - and they were all hungry. On that day, we made Lucy a promise. We promised to feed her and her classmates, to fix their broken desks, to provide books and sanitary pads - everything they needed to succeed at school.

With our support, Lucy - and 40 other girls - have attended senior high school. Lucy is now the first person from her village to go to university - and she hopes to become a midwife: **"I will go back to my village and save people's life - and be a role model for the other girls."**

OLIVIA'S STORY

Lucy's classmate Olivia is also an incredible success story - and we are delighted she now works as our Assistant Hub Manager, supporting other girls through senior high school. **"My family and the whole community are very proud of me and whatever I am today and whoever I will be tomorrow, is all because of ATE."**
