The literacy rate in Upper West Ghana is just 40.5% - and most children have no opportunity to read beyond the few curriculum books they have access to at school. We are changing that, with our two beautiful libraries and transformational outreach work, bringing joy, education and opportunity to hundreds of children.

We opened libraries in our Lawra and Nandom Inclusion Centres in 2025 - and they have become a huge success. After school and on Saturday mornings, they are packed with children enjoying and sharing the experience of reading, story-telling, drawing and playing games and puzzles. There's a lot of fun - and a lot of learning. In just one year, we've had an incredible 12,500 individual attendances!

Baku Blandina, Lawra assistant, said: **"Seeing what the children can do - some narrate a story to their friends without looking inside the book, some who couldn't even say two letters can now say them all - I feel so happy."**

Now, we're taking our libraries 'on the road' with book boxes to ultra rural schools so no-one is left out. One school has even designated Fridays as "Library Day"!
